Chairman's Opening Address and Review of 2009/2010

However fifty plus members and wives attended the Annual Re-union in Nottingham and well over fifty were at our own branch BBQ. The annual rugby match at Twickenham was well attended either as a group or individually. A small number made the long trip to Wales for the annual gathering of those members and wives of the AEA who like to climb mountains and go for long walks along the shore line and finish up drinking a little of the amber nectar.

Billy Morris and Bob Chatterton now joined by Dave Liebrick like nothing better than running anything between twenty-five to thirty miles during a weekend which they have been doing for most of the year

The Spring Lunch was again held in the Squires Holt Restaurant and proved to be very popular again with forty-five plus members attending. A surprise 50th Wedding Anniversary present and a large cake were presented to Betty and Fred Gray to celebrate the event. This was very much appreciated by them both.

Mick Leather remains a member but works in Russia and that gives him a reasonable excuse for not attending the meetings.

Throughout the year eight funerals of AEA members were very well attended by members of the Aldershot Branch it incurred many miles of driving for most members. This included the funeral of Louis Gallagher in Taunton.

- The AEA Constitution is now complete and is to be delivered to all members of the association.
- A grant of £ 300 has been made to the Double Hills memorial fund and it is hoped that a further regular payment can be made on an annual basis.
- The AGM and re-unions for 2011 is to be organized by the Yorkshire Branch and 2012 by the 299 Branch (Hull) of the AEA
- The association committee are to reduce the number of meeting in a year from three to two.
- Tickets for the World Cup draw are selling well and further tickets are available from Joe Stoddart MBE.
