Chairman's Opening Remarks

- The Chairman thanked all for attending.
- A 2 minute silence was held for departed comrades.

Minutes of the Previous Meeting

Comment was called for on the Minutes of the Previous Meeting held at Ripon on 7 February 2010.

John Lee raised the point that the arrangements for the 35th Anniversary of Ex Trent Chase (during which 11 members of 300Tp 131 Indep Para Sqn RE (V) were killed) are still not clear. He undertook to clarify the details and ensure they are published for AEA Members. (Previously raised by Bunny Brown at Ripon).

There being no further matters arising the minutes were accepted. Proposed by John Smith, seconded by Dave Rutter. **CARRIED.**

Treasurer's Report

A copy of the Treasurer's Report is at Attachment 1. Dick Brown also stated the following:

- After investigating the advantages and disadvantages of Long Term Investment for income generation, the risk to Charitable Status outweighs the financial gain. This avenue is therefore closed.
- A significant donation has been received from the Estate of the late Bob Kennedy, former soldier of 9 Parachute Squadron RE and good friend to many in the Association.
- Dick closed by thanking Joe Stoddart for organizing and executing the World Cup Draw – the draw was a success and raised much needed funds.

Proposed by John Lee, seconded by Dave Rutter that the Treasurer's Report be accepted. **CARRIED.**

Journal/Editor's Report

Dave Rutter stated that we now have a distribution list of some 700 members. He went on to state that Articles should be submitted in plain text (Windows 7) and should be accompanied by photographs. Branches are requested to encourage their members to submit as much material as possible. When making submissions (particularly Branch Reports), it is requested that the relevance of material to the wider Association is considered.

Dave pointed out that, because of copyright issues, the Article '*Legacy of the Back Pack Parachute*' (Issue 31, Aug 2010) should not be reproduced in any way. All members please note.

Dave concluded by stating that the pending VAT increase will not, this time, increase the Journal subscription.

Proposed by Billy Morris, seconded by John Smith that the Journal Report be accepted. **CARRIED.**

Membership Report

Billy Morris stated that the membership stood at 1394. Take up of Membership is most optimistically described as 'steady'! There has been an increase of 5 members since the last report.

Archivist/Historian Report

Fred Gray reported that he is currently revamping the method of holding/presenting the records. All records will be placed chronologically in folders protected by plastic inserts. To complete their presentation, Logos and labels are required.

Afternote: Billy Morris will provide the Logos and labels.

In consultation with John Hooper, Fred has undertaken the task of committing the history of 'The 9th' to paper for the period 1947-1990. This task will be ongoing for some time to come, Fred will keep us updated on progress.

The Chairman directed that a vote of thanks was recorded to Fred from The Council.

Proposed by Billy Morris, seconded by Dick Brown: 'That the Historian/Archivist Report be Accepted as Presented'. **CARRIED.**

Sports Report

The written report, presented by Billy Morris, is reproduced at Attachment 3.

Billy also submitted a request that the Council accept the disbandment of the AEA Sports Club on the grounds that the Long-Distance Running Events tend to be the only ones reported.

For representational purposes, Billy intends to continue with the Long-Distance Events but re-name his intrepid, but small, band of participants as 'The AEA Ultra Club.

This request/change was accepted by the Council.

Proposed by John Lee, seconded by Dick Brown: 'That the Sports Report be Accepted as Presented'. **CARRIED.**

Shop Report

Dave Rutter reported on behalf of Jeanette. The shop continues to do well, turnover has been approx £2000 since Jeanette took the helm.

The shop will be fully operational at the AGM 2010, timings TBC on arrival. Posters etc. will be provided by Billy Morris.

Dave is currently investigating the supply of wreaths etc. for funerals/commemorations – details will be promulgated when confirmed.

Dave requested an audit of the Shop Accounts, this will be carried out by Dick Brown.
